Delivery and Collection

Each entry is to be delivered to the Guild Office in a padded bag clearly labelled with the entrant's name and title of work by 4.00pm 26 September 2021. A swing tag with the entrant's name and title of work should be pinned or tied to the work. This will be replaced by an entry number for judging so that the judges do not know who has entered each item. Do not write your name on the work. A picture labelled with your name and title of entry should be included in the bag for identification purposes. This does not have to be of high quality.

Members are responsible for the postage and insurance (if required) both to and from the Guild. The collection date for items after the display will be advised when gallery arrangements have been finalised.
